He has taught at Westminster Theological Seminary, Philadelphia, Reformed Seminary, Washington, DC, and London Bible College (now LST). His books include The Work of Christ, The Holy Trinity (second edition due in 2019), The Westminster Assembly, and Union with Christ. His Systematic Theology is due for release in 2019 by Crossway.

Dr Robert Strivens is pastor of Bradford on Avon Baptist Church. He lectures in church history at London Seminary, speaks occasionally at fraternals and conferences and has a blog, 'Through

the Wilds of the Desert'.

Why should Baptists care about Dort? - The year 2019 marks the 400th anniversary of the Canons of Dort, which supplied a theological and ecclesial response to the increasingly popular teaching of Arminius. They continue to be important in defending Biblical truth, and nurture our souls in godliness.
