Jeffery Smith has been in pastoral ministry since 1990, and since 2009 has been serving at Emmanuel Baptist Church, Coconut Creek, Florida. In addition to his regular pastoral responsibilities, Jeff speaks at various conferences and serves on the governing board and as lecturer for Reformed Baptist Seminary. He is the author of *Lazarus and the Rich Man: The Plain Truth About Life After Death* published by EP.

Jeff will be bringing three messages, focusing on **The Cross of Christ: The Message of the Cross, The Preaching of the Cross, and The Cross and the Pattern of Christian Ministry.**



Dr Kees van Kralingen is an elder in the Independent Baptist Church of Papendrecht, The Netherlands with responsibilities for teaching and mission, and is the editor of *Reformation Today*.
